

Consequences	<ul> <li>In our classrooms we will:</li> <li>Have a 3 strike system.</li> <li>Once students have had 3 warnings about any of the above behaviours they are sent into their buddy-teacher's classroom.</li> <li>After students have completed the set work they are to come back into the classroom and have a restorative conversation with the teacher.</li> <li>This behaviour will then be recorded on Sentral.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Following major behaviours students will:</li> <li>Be withdrawn to the learning space to complete the 'Behavioural Reflections' sheet.</li> <li>After students have complete the sheet, they will have a restorative conversation with the teacher.</li> <li>This behaviour will then be recorded on Sentral.</li> <li>Next playtime, the student will walk with a teacher on yard duty.</li> <li>If behaviour escalates, the student will be sent to the principal</li> <li>Parents/carers will be called as required</li> </ul>

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- Greet students
- Be organised and on time to class
- Explicitly teach and model classroom rules and expectations
- Establish classroom norms
- Acknowledge positive behaviour with classroom rewards
- Recognise positive changes in behaviour
- Check in with students as required
